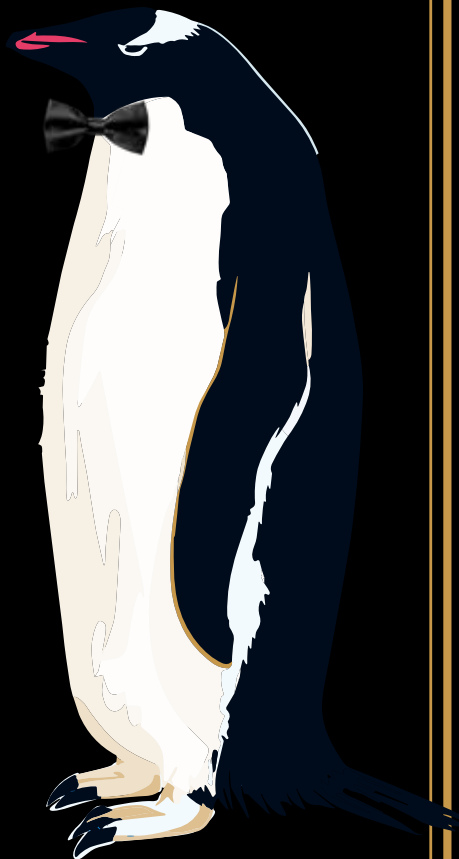

I have a deep personal belief in trying to squeeze every possible bit of life out of the time we're given. I've been fortunate to work with St Clare Hospice for a number of years and they epitomise this.

They need more than £16,000 per day to operate and we're aiming to keep them going for two weeks.
